PLANNING YOUR ZOO VISIT

COVID-19 Safety Measures

We strongly recommend that guests follow CDC guidelines when indoors and when social distancing outside is unachievable. Hand washing and hand sanitizer stations are available throughout the park and where education programs are conducted.

Chaperones

Chaperones must accompany children at all times. We require a minimum of one adult for every 10 children.

Name Tags/Clothing

We recommend name tags be worn by each person but not attached with straight pins, which could cause harm to the animals. The Zoo is an outdoor facility; children should dress appropriately for current weather conditions. Closed-toe shoes, socks, sunglasses, insect repellent, hats, and sunscreen are recommended. Umbrellas and rain ponchos may also be appropriate.

Parking

If you are arriving by bus, follow the signs to the designated bus parking area on the far side of the parking lot. We encourage schools to consider using private bus carriers in order to spend more time at the Zoo.

Late Arrivals

If you have scheduled an education program and are running late, please call 407-323-4450, x 121, 123, 125, or 0 for assistance. We will gladly make allowances for your group if you notify us prior to your arrival. If after 30 minutes your group has not yet arrived, and we have not heard from you, your program will be cancelled. We reserve the right to adjust program length depending on staff availability.

PLEASE NOTE OUTSIDE FOOD IS NOT PERMITTED INSIDE THE ZOO. PLEASE LEAVE LUNCHES ON THE BUS, IN YOUR VEHICLE, OR IN A HARD-SIDED NON-FABRIC CONTAINER WITH A LID.
